July Treasurer Report

June Started off with just over \$62,000 in the bank. We have had multiple expenses getting ready for the fair, the larger ones being ½ of the Airbound (rides) payment of \$7770, rodeo flags of \$5,250, website design payment, Mountain Mail for Fair Guides and Discover magazine of \$5850, plus several smaller expenses. June's ending balance was just over \$42,000.

We have several outstanding expenses that will be paid fair week or just after Fair. This includes the 2nd half payment to Airbound of \$7770, Hotels just at \$5,000, \$3500 to Rockin Rentals for the Blow Up rides for rodeo weekend, and \$11,500 to Rawhide Rodeo. We also have to pay the Bands, etc.

I have put in the request for the County Funds we get annually. Last year that amount was \$31,000 so I am expecting the same amount this year. That should be deposited by Fair Week . With all of the incoming and outgoing I am looking at about \$42,000-\$43,000 going into Fair Week. I know there will be multiple expenses that will come up that I am unaware of with this being my first fair as Treasurer. I think we are going to have a great Fair!!!

Randy:

Would like a schedule of what is happening during the fair when and who is in charge.

There are 6 spots available for RV plugs in. Please let Miki know who needs what, Pueblo bouncy house group needs 2 for the first weekend.
